Parts of Speech

The Basic Ones

- Nouns are things (boy, chicken, school, happiness)
- Verbs show action (laugh, think, run, live)
- Adjectives describe nouns (blue, confused, exciting)
- Adverbs describe verbs or adjectives (quickly, very, usually)

Nouns

Nouns are things.

- People (boy, hairdresser, Norma)
- Places (school, kitchen, California)
- Things (cow, spoon, head, happiness)
- Subjects of sentences
- -ing verb forms (smoking)
- Sometimes use articles (a/an, the)

Verbs

Verbs show actions.

- Actions done by the nouns
- Physical actions (move, swim, jump)
- Unseen actions (think, feel, understand)
- Many forms

Adjectives

Adjectives describe nouns.

- Can go before nouns: The happy girl laughed.
- Can go after verbs: The joke was funny.
- Can use comparative forms: He is taller than his brother. I am the oldest.

Adverbs

Adverbs describe verbs or adjectives.

- Can go before or after verbs: We talked loudly. We loudly talked.
- Go before adjectives: They are extremely intelligent.
- Usually end in -ly.
